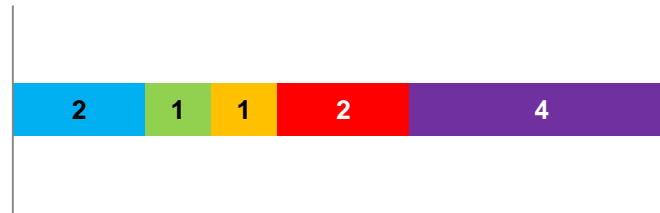
Dissection back at Boards

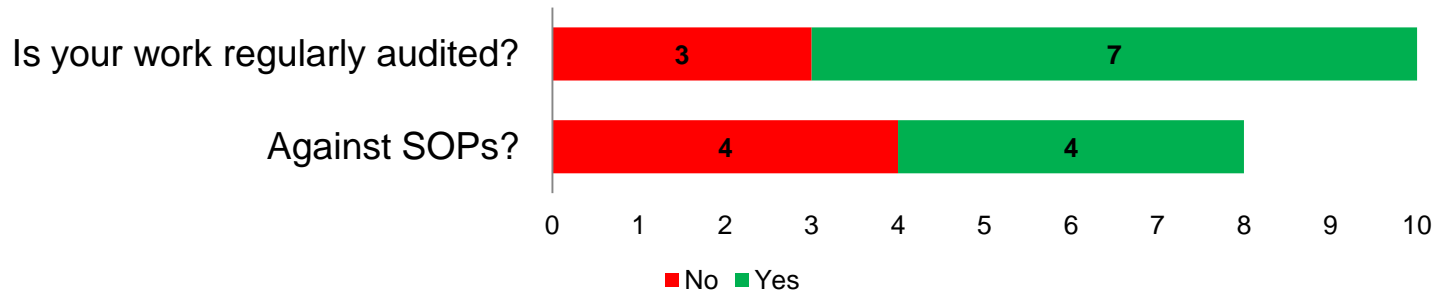
How many samples dissectors can practice on each week



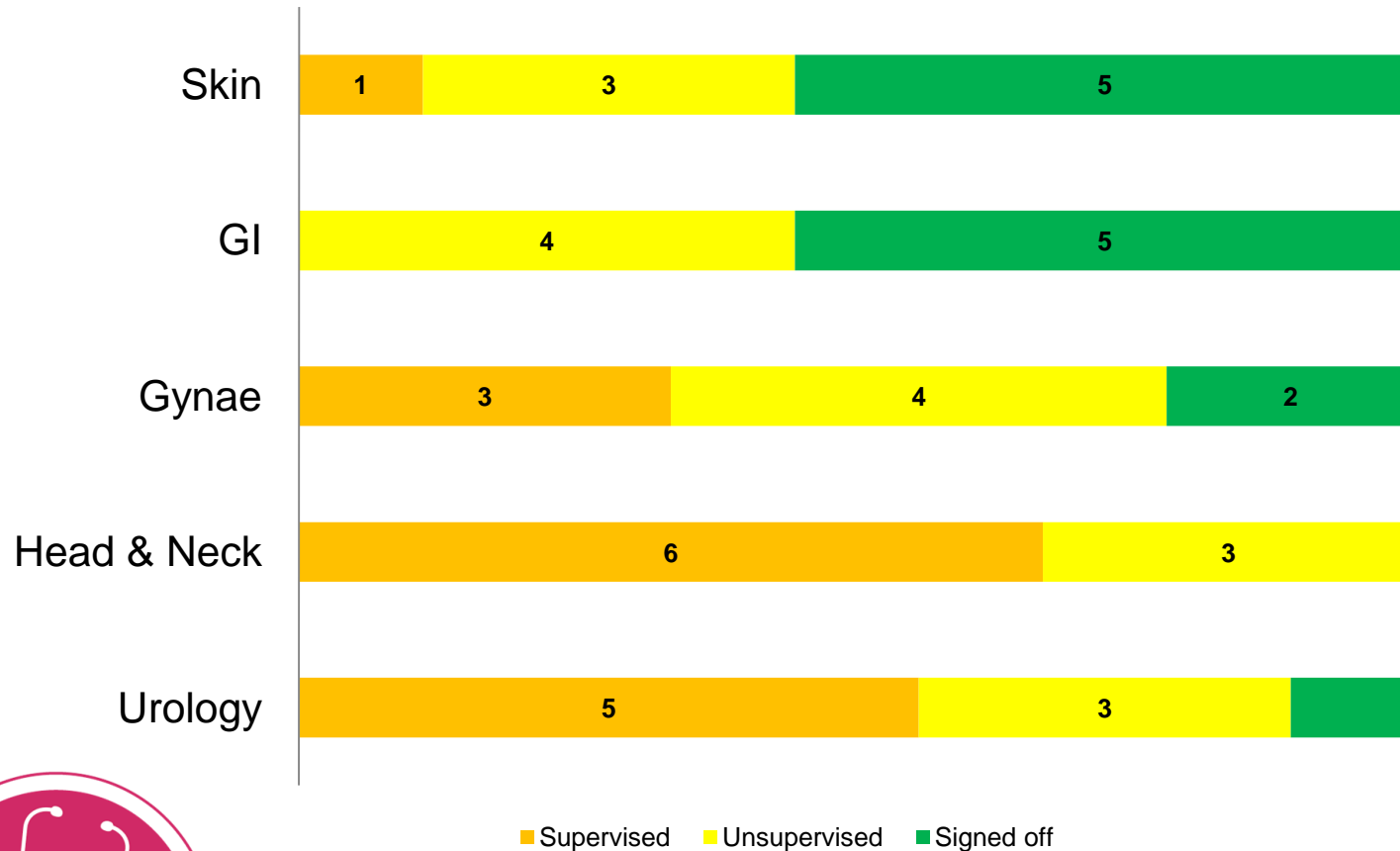

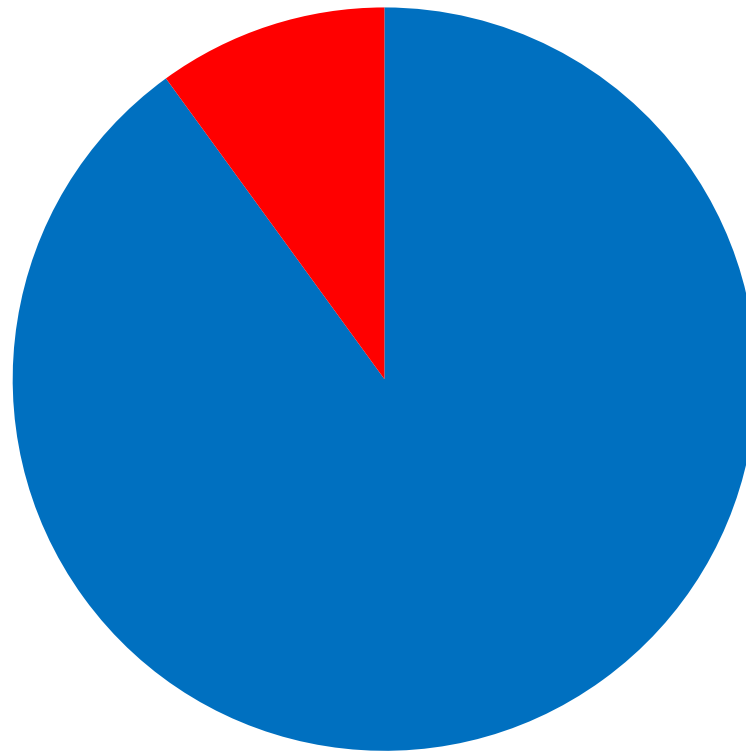

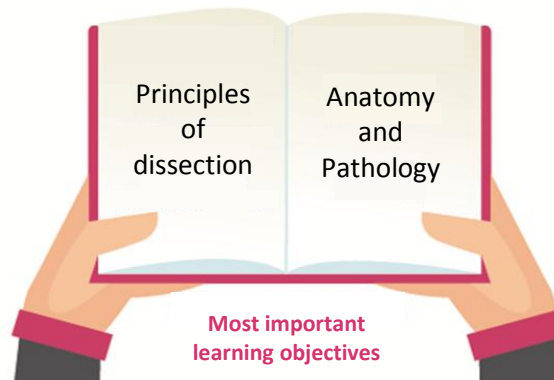
