


Progression

 No career pathway in place for BSW staff due to lack of degree in East.



Solution: November 2009.


- Collaboration with Adam Smith and Forth Valley Colleges
 to deliver programme by twilight teaching
- Funded by Skills Development Scotland 20 places
- 13 staff funded
 - 5 level 2 qualification [National Progression Award]
 - 8 level 3 qualification [Professional Development Award]
- Success
 - Level 2 all 5 passed
 - Level 3 7 staff passed.



Problems



- Twilight teaching
 - 2pm 7pm
 - Long days for staff
 - Difficulty in allocation of rooms
 - Difficulty in carrying out practical elements all students travelled to Fife to undertake practicals at the College.
- Still no progression for successful staff at level 3
- No recurrent funding



Solution - 2012



- Formal partnership with Fife College
- Utilised space within laboratory suite at St John's Hospital to establish The Science Training School
 - Class Room
 - Resource Room
 - Training Laboratory
- Developed a bespoke programme aligning to laboratory and professional requirements delivered by both tutors and NHS Lothian staff







- Current employer contribution: £2500








Programmes delivered at the STS Senior Phase Programme

 - Monday / Tuesday HNC Applied Science






Network

Number of staff dropped out of course [2]







Current development

- Degree IBMS accreditation: Edinburgh University: Full/ Part time course
- HCS MA Programme
 - developed and formally ratified
 - Next step is to implement apprenticeship programme in NHS Lothian
 - Develop this into a regional programme
- HND Delivery: Bring HND Yr 1 back into STS
